MALAYSIA CONTINUES TO WIN BID FOR INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL CONFERENCE

 The 9th Congress of The Asian Society of Cardiovascular Imaging (ASCI) 2015 to be held for the first time in Malaysia

Kuala Lumpur, 20 May 2014 – The Malaysia Convention & Exhibition Bureau (MyCEB) announces the bid win of the 9th Congress of The Asian Society of Cardiovascular Imaging (ASCI) 2015 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia from 11 – 13 June 2015. The congress, which will be organised by the Society of Asian Society of Cardiovascular Imaging (ASCI) for the first time in Malaysia, will be held at the Le Meridien, Kuala Lumpur.

The ASCI 2015 will is expected to attract over 500 international delegates with an estimated economic impact of RM3.55 million (USD 1.1 million). "With medical tourism being heavily promoted in Malaysia, it is only natural that one of MyCEB's focuses is on making Malaysia the destination for healthcare professionals to organise meetings and conventions. The objectives are to encourage better understanding of the industry in Malaysia and to further enhance knowledge amongst the industry through exchange of ideas and expertise. We look forward to hosting ASCI 2015," Zulkefli Hj Sharif, CEO of Malaysia Convention & Exhibition Bureau.

"We are proud to be organising the Annual ASCI Congress for the first time Malaysia and we hope to provide a very exciting international programme in Cardiac CT, Cardiac MRI and ECHO with regional emphasis. The theme for ASCI 2015 is "Cardiac Harmony Through Imaging"," said Dr Sim Kui Hian, Visiting consultant cardiologist, Heart Centre, Sarawak General Hospital, Malaysia and Organising Chairman of ASCI 2015.

"The ASCI is a platform for us to advance and improve the understanding of research and teachings of cardiovascular imaging. We believe this will strengthen the medical practise in Malaysia through the participation of professionals facilitating the cardiovascular research in the region. Most importantly it also enables an environment for our young cardiovascular researchers to develop in the cardiovascular field," he added.





The three day congress to be held on 11 – 13 June 2015 will gather medical doctors, academics, researchers, practitioners, specialists, students and professionals in the area of cardiovascular imaging from Malaysia, Asian countries and other countries worldwide. Malaysia is targeted to yield an estimated RM3.5 million in economic impact and also expected to yield RM2.2 million from visitor expenditures.
