Chin Swee Temple is located in Genting Highlands at 4,600 feet above sea level and is less than one

hour from Kuala Lumpur. It is a perfect getaway for those who wish to escape from the city. This

unique place is situated on a rocky forested mountain overlooking lush green slopes of virgin forests,

embrace by cool crisp mountain air.

Chin Swee Caves Temple has always been regarded as a peaceful place for purifying the mind and soul. It is a tourist hub with complete Chinese traditional culture and legend, including nine-colour dragon wall of luck which consist of nine different colours of dragon representing different types of luck; the iconic nine-storey Pagoda decorated with hundreds of Buddha figurines. Visitors also come to Chin Swee Temple to offer prayers to Chin Swee deity and ask for blessings from Buddha. Besides this, Chin Swee Cave Temple also boasts of its 35,000 square feet observation area fondly known as Sky Terrace that offers magnificent mountain views.
