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MALAYSIA GETS THUMBS UP FOR HOSTING AVIATION SECURITY WORLD CONFERENCE

The first-ever AVSEC World Conference in Southeast Asia hailed as a success by participants and exhibitors; generating an estimated RM 5.2 million in economic impact.

KUALA LUMPUR, 27 October 2016 – Organisers, delegates, exhibitors and speakers heaped praises on Malaysia for successfully hosting the 25th AVSEC World Conference which ended here today. The 3-day conference, the first to be held in Southeast Asia, brought together over 500 top security experts, government agencies, defence and equipment and technology manufacturers to deliberate and address evolving security risks with integrated solutions.

Organised by The International Air Transport Association (IATA) together with the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and Airports Council International (ACI), the conference received strong support from the Malaysia Convention & Exhibition Bureau (MyCEB), an agency under the Ministry of Tourism and Culture.

“Kuala Lumpur was chosen as the host city for the 25th AVSEC Conference because of its good connectivity, strong local support and an excellent array of venues to choose from. I am pleased to say that the delegates were very receptive and positive. The facilities were excellent and the feedback from the exhibitors was great given the high number of attendees and visitors. This is the fourth event I have organised in Kuala Lumpur and it is something that runs very smoothly,” said Ms. Jill Schaefer, Senior Manager, WorldTEK Events, San Diego, United States of America and a member of the Organising Committee.

The estimated economic impact of the conference is expected to generate a total of RM5.2 million, projecting excellent opportunities for Malaysia to bid and host aviation related conferences.
